Local workers irked over firm's hirings

Union claims Pulte Homes failed to take on area laborers for Wellington Crossing

WALTHAM - Contributions to local preservation projects won't get the builders of a Trapelo Road condominium complex onto Paul Pavone's

Minnesota-based Pulte has Homes contributed \$110,000 to local projects, including \$5,000 most recently to restore a graveyard on state land recently added to the Beaver Brook Reservation. But the company left local workers out in the cold, said Pavone, a laborers union official, after buying rights to build Wellington Crossing, last year.

"We worked hard on that project," Pavone said, "and I didn't get a day's work for a laborer on the job over there."

Pavone, business manager of the Laborers International Local 560, said the union supported special permits needed for the project, based on an understanding with the site's original developer, Texas-based JPL
