"The project consists of 268 units to be located in six garden style buildings and 19 townhouses. The project also includes significant site and infrastructure work associated with the development of these homes," reads the letter signed by attorney Donald Borenstein.

Blute said 112 units have been completed and several others are under construction. Of the finished condos, 62 have been closed out and other buyers are waiting to " move in until the Building Department begins to reissue occupancy pérmits, Blute said.

In a construction time line provided to the council, Pulte Homes lists the fifth garden building - containing 50 units - as the next step in construction to begin by June. Pulte does not expect. to complete the entire project until May 2009, but the council can only give extensions for one year at a time.

"We'll just have to come in at the end of the year and ask for another 10 months or so - that's actually pretty will common," Blute said. "We are on schedule with con- i. struction for the project." --, C 11.1
