If you use a permanent marker and write the numbers 1 to 5 on the dial, it will make it much easier for you to adjust it in the future. (Or just write **W**inter and **S**ummer at the appropriate spots.)



Tip of the Month #2

If you never changed your heating/cooling air filter, you should think about doing so. The air conditioning unit works very efficiently with a new filter. To purchase you can contact The Home Depot; the filters are a special order.

Tip of the Month #3

If you are thinking of obtaining one of the approved storage units to put into your parking space, consider purchasing it an Ace Hardware store. They are much less expensive there than many other places. The only drawback is that you have to arrange by yourself for the local delivery from the Ace store to your garage space.

Water Update

The Board of Trustees has approved the installation of irrigation water meters which will be installed in mid January. The separate meter will help reduce the waste water charged

associated with the consumption of water. Also, as many residents may have already noticed an increase in the water pressure due to the recently installed booster pumps. We will keep you informed as to progress on this issue.

Parking Lot Passes

The City of Waltham provides parking passes to all the seniors who apply. The cost is \$1.00 for the entire year 2008 and is valid at any and all the municipal parking lots. To obtain a pass, all you need do is bring your drivers license and auto registration to the Senior Center. The car doesn't even have to be registered in Waltham. The pass is great if you like to go to the movies on weekdays or eat lunch on Moody Street during the week.

Tax Abatements

Did you notice on your real estate tax bill that the City of Waltham sent recently includes an exemption when they calculated the tax? All seniors who are owner occupants in Waltham are entitled to the abatement. There are other types of real estate abatements also available but one must submit a filled out form to City Hall. To be eligible for these other abatements, you must be legally blind, a disabled veteran or a surviving spouse, etc. Blank forms are available at the Senior Center.

Friendly Reminder

The following item is primarily for unit owners of the mid-rises. Please try to be considerate of your neighbors regarding noise. Residents and guests may consider walking softly especially on the wooden floors. Also for you insomniacs, please do not vacuum in the middle of the night nor use the kitchen disposal.
