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CONDO ODDS & ENDS Capital improvements

Building Representatives asked the Trustees to consider installing benches outside the buildings and a shelter for the townhouse mailboxes. They realized that these could be considered capital improvements and that they were not included in the current year's budget. However, the management company and the building reps are going to pull together specifications and associated costs involved with these items and will recommend that the Trustees include these expenses in the 2009 budget. One suggestion bν Representatives, for bicycle racks in the garages, has been approved and Crowninshield will have them ordered and installed this summer

Involvement

Dan Blechman is personally soliciting each and every townhouse owner to think about getting involved in the future managing of Wellington Crossing. Quite a few seem to be responsive. It would really be nice if the people in the mid-rise buildings were as responsive. We must remember that when we have our own Board, the rules state that at least 1 trustee must be from the town houses and there must be 5 in total. Nothing requires that there be any people from the mid rise buildings on the Board. So will some of you start raising your hands? It is going to take a little time reading and preparing. you qualified people, don't forget that the only thing worse than unqualified people running for office is if they get elected and they will if they are the only ones running.

A few of the owners here are correctly assuming that quite a few of the committees will actually get formed well before the elections of Trustees are held. Also, don't forget that each of the eventual Trustees will probably be on at least one committee. For example, if you might be interested in eventually being on the finance committee, now is the time. Very soon, the process of creating next year's operating budget and capital reserve budget is going to start. It will be a great learning experience watching how the professionals do it. The Pulte Trustees and Crowninshield Management certainly will be supportive of this learning process. This will definitely be the first opportunity and may be the last opportunity to see how they do it. By the way, if you are interested, you may call Crowninshield and ask for the financial reports for so far this year and also for the budget for this year and then you can do your own Last year's financial review by the independent auditor is not completed but when it is, Crowninshield will gladly provide this upon request.

An Ad Hoc building maintenance committee will also probably be one of the early committees One of the early tasks for the formed. committee will very likely be a walk through of buildings the with Pulte of Crowninshield representatives to determine what needs to be repaired to any of the common building area prior to the big turnover. Some condos actually hire a professional engineering firm to do this and to also develop a long term replacement budget proposal.

A grounds maintenance committee will need to perform a similar task. These committees could use the help of all of us. If any of us sees anything that we think should be fixed, we should let our reps know and they will either try to address the item prior to the big walkthroughs or get the items into the hands of the appropriate committees when they get formed. Considering

the quality of work Pulte and Crowninshield have been doing, there probably will not be too many items.

Of course, the new Trustees will have to hire an attorney for the condo and will have to renew a few different forms of insurance policies which are already in place. Pulte and Crowninshield will certainly help but it is our long term investment that must be protected. Thus we will probably want a few people to do homework concerning these items well before the turnover. And the list goes on.

OUR REPRESENTATIVES REPORT

This section was submitted for inclusion by our reps. It is a brief set of minutes of the latest monthly meeting they had with Crowninshield and the Pulte Trustees. Because of the editing and printing cycle of this newsletter, their report has been edited slightly to keep the information timely.

- 1. Landscaping planting improvement was submitted by Greener and approved.
- 2. Water Meters: Waltham's engineering department requested additional information which Pulte is now providing.
- 3. Drier vents are scheduled for inspection and cleaning for Bldg 1 on July 7, 8, & 9.
- 4. Asphalt paving is expected to be done in June. The areas to be done are the last section of Town Houses on Bartlett Way, and the top of the hill at the dumpster pad as well as in front of bldg 4 and around the corner towards bldg 5.
- 5. Request was made to have NSTAR do a study of how we can lower our Electric bill which represents almost 25% of our operating expenses.
- 6. Request was made to get an estimate of the cost of adding a sprinkler system to the rear of the Town Houses!!!
- 7. Requested to Pulte to be personally involved with the selection of exercise equipment and that the exercise room is opened ASAP!!!
- 8. Crowninshield is looking at having a paper recycling dumpster installed. They have a complete documentation package which they are reviewing. Once the dumpster enclosure is finished we will know how large a container can be placed on site.

Jordan Marsh Blueberry Muffins

½ cup butter

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

2 cup flour presifted

2 tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. salt

½ cup milk

2 ½ cups blueberries

1 tsp. vanilla

2 tsp. sugar for top

On low speed, cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time and mix until blended. Sift dry ingredients and add alternately with milk. Mash ½ cup berries and stir in by hand. Add rest of the blueberries and stir in by hand. Grease muffin tins well with butter and grease top surface of pan as well. Pile mix high in each muffin cup. Sprinkle sugar over tops. Bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes. Cool in pan at least 30 minutes.

The York Harbor Inn's Warm Artichoke Dip

12 oz. cream cheese

1/4 cup red peppers, finely diced

2 tsp. onions, finely diced

3 tsp. white wine

2 tsp. Dijon mustard

1/4 tsp. paprika

1/2 tsp. garlic, minced

3/4 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. white pepper

1 Tbs. fresh lemon juice

1 can (14 oz.) artichoke hearts, drained and diced large,

3/4 cup fine bread crumbs, unseasoned.

1/4 cup butter, melted

In a food processor fitted with a steel blade, combine cream cheese, red peppers, onions, white wine, Dijon mustard, paprika, garlic, salt, white pepper, and lemon juice. Process to mix well. Mix in the artichokes. Put into an ovenproof dish. Mix the crumbs with the butter and spread on top. Bake at 325 until heated thoroughly (20 minutes).
