WALTHAM - Steps will be taken soon to boost the level of pedestrian safety at a crosswalk on Trapelo Road that some have deemed dangerous.

Meanwhile, a long-range plan could be in the works to tackle safety issues on the entire roadway.

Ward 3 Councilor George A. Darcy said at Monday's meeting of the City Council's Public Works Committee that he was particularly concerned about safety at the crosswalk at Trapello Road and Clocktower Drive, site of the Wellington Crossing condominium development.

He said vehicles traveling west didn't have enough distance after coming up a hill to stop for pedestrians at the crosswalk.

Transportation Director Frank Ching said he would eval-

uate the crosswalk. Yesterday, in an e-mail to members of the committee, Ching said that reflective lime green "Crosswalk Ahead' signs would be installed on Trapelo Road westbound near the intersection sometime this week.

Ching said in the e-mail that he also talked to the Police Department about the need for more enforcement of speeding around that section of Trapelo Road

In addition, Ching said that his department would try to deter-

> mine whether the crosswalk was properly placed, given the posted speed of 35 miles per hour

Ching suggested at Monday's Public Works Committee meeting that a long-range salety plan was needed to ad-

dress safety on Trapelo Road He said that the road has been increasingly stressed by extratraffic volume over the years.

"Trapelo Road was a country road that wasn't built for the kind of traffic it takes now," Ching said.

The committee asked that Ching come back in the fall with a preliminary plan for improvements

Darcy said vesterday that he recently walked down Trapelo Road from the Belmont to Lincoln borders to evaluate the condition of sidewalks. He said he hoped to address the issue at a meeting of the Traffic Commission later this month

The whole focus is to inrease the safety for pedestrian access on Trapelo Road," Darcy said
