A AND B TRUSTEES AT WORK

Transition Study:

- General Items: Pulte has completed all of the items on the original draft Transition Study Report.
- Retaining Walls: The work on the wall located adjacent to the service road behind Buildings 2 and 3 has been completed. Work on other walls may need to be delayed until the spring given the temperature requirements of some of the materials to be used. The City of Waltham will continue to hold a bond from Pulte until all work recommended by our engineer is completed by Pulte.
- The final Transition Study Reports: One each for A and B, were received from Reserve Advisors in late December. Copies of the two reports are in the Crowninshield on-site administrators' office for homeowners to peruse.

Updating of Trust Documents:

- Homeowners of A: The process is being conducted in two steps given the current Declaration of Trust requires at least 71% of the voting power to amend the document. The attorney's first recommendation is to amend the Declaration of Trust to reduce the required voting power from the current requirement of at least 71% to at least 51% of the voting power: this would then be in agreement with the Declaration of Trust for Wellington Crossing B. The first part of a two step process started in January with a mailing to The mailing included the each homeowner. attorney's recommendation, ballot and postage paid envelope addressed to Crowninshield. Ballots are being returned for this first recommendation and being reviewed to determine a quorum. A second ballot with several recommendations from the attorney for updating the Declaration of Trust will be sent to homeowners at the conclusion of the voting on the first ballot.
- Homeowners of B: A quorum has been reached with five of the six amendments being approved. See your glass bulletin board for details.

 <u>All homeowners who have not returned their</u> <u>ballet are reminded to complete and return their</u> <u>original ballot in a timely manner to avoid the</u> <u>cost of a repeat mailing.</u>

Fire Suppression Systems:

• The systems were inspected in December and Trustees received the report in mid January. Given several items are to be addressed, the Trustees met with the company that conducted the inspections and steps were initiated to have the required work performed.

Clubhouse:

• Exercise Room: A survey is being conducted of gym users to determine the use of the various pieces of equipment. This will help Trustees evaluate the request for purchasing an elliptical machine. Given space is limited in the room, usage of equipment needs to be determined.

Development of James P Falzone Memorial Park:

 Trustees learned recently of a public meeting conducted January 27th at the City of Waltham Government Center regarding potential improvements to the park. One of the proposals is to build a skateboarding area in the park.

CROWNINSHIELD CORNER

Maintenance

- The general repairs in the common areas of the midrise buildings continue. Maintenance has completed this in Buildings 1-4 with several items handled in Building 5 earlier in 2010 at the request of several homeowners. The work in Building 5 is being completed.
- Maintenance has sealed the door of an old pump house which remains on the property from the hospital that was previously located on the Wellington Crossing site.

- Maintenance has adjusted the light sensors for the B garage carriage lights.
- The clean up in Building 4 entry and lobby from a pet accident that occurred about two months ago has required several levels of work during numerous visits by professional cleaners. It is believed that the smell and stains have now been eradicated. Also, in December, a jar of tomato sauce was spilled in the elevator in Building 4 requiring further efforts of the professional cleaners. Homeowners are reminded to clean up any solid waste, blot the fluid and notify the Crowninshield on-site office so that professional cleaners or have their own personal cleaning personnel try to handle a spill or stain.
- Four traffic posts were installed being Buildings 2 and 3 on the access road. These will prevent plows and other vehicles damaging exterior gas meters.
- The locksmith has addressed issues with the entry doors in Buildings 4 and 5 regarding alignment and a leaking hydraulic piston, respectively.
- J McNabb (Crowninshield) and Peter Monahan (Trustee from A) have worked together on a list of routine maintenance items needed throughout the community. This has been used to update the job description for Crowninshield on-site maintenance position and insure appropriate routine maintenance in our community.
- Waverly Landscaping handled the Christmas weekend and mid January snow accumulations well receiving many compliments from homeowners. <u>Residents parking in front of mid rise buildings are</u> <u>asked to refresh themselves on the snow removal</u> <u>policy which is posted in the glass bulletin board</u>.
- Stormwater Solutions has completed work handling findings in their on-site inspection conducted in the fourth quarter of 2010.
- The City of Waltham recently completed testing of the backflow values in the townhouses and Buildings 3 and 6.

Other:

 Required in-unit safety alarm testing has been a challenge in a few units despite having inspectors onsite over several dates each month July-November. Information for units where access has not been granted has been reported to the City of Waltham Fire Department. Hereafter, Trustees are considering any repeat visits by the inspectors to be made at the expense of the individual homeowner not keeping their first scheduled appointment in an effort to contain homeowners' fees for all.

- Dryer vent cleaning will be starting with Buildings 3 and 4. This will require access to the laundry room of each unit and will be scheduled with the homeowner. Trustees are considering that any repeat visits by the cleaning service to be made at the expense of the individual homeowner not keeping their first scheduled appointment, again in an effort to contain homeowners' fees for all owners.
- Return of the homeowner/resident and pet registration forms has remained a challenge. The vast majority of homeowners responded with the initial mailing; however, several attempts at follow up with missing forms have still not produced all of the forms for a handful of homeowners. The on-site staff and a volunteer from Building 5 continue to follow up to secure the missing forms.
- The hours of the on-site administrative staff were changed recently: Monday-Wednesday and Friday 12:00 noon – 5:00 p.m. and Thursday 3:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
- The on-site administrative staff continues to update the phone/buzzer and email listings.
- The on-site administrative staff continues to prepare documents for homeowners who are refinancing and units that are changing ownership.
- There were three rentals of the Clubhouse during the month of January.
